2nd Prize = 1 year of Reduced Parking at the Turtle Loops





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LCWS Faculty and Staff Volunteer at Waldorf Schools Around the World

We have some world travellers among our faculty and staff who have recently devoted their vacations to volunteering at Waldorf schools in Peru, India and Guatemala. This piece, the last in the series, was written by **Kristin DeVoe-Talluto** who spent February break in Guatemala.

Jim and I travelled extensively in India and Asia in 1997-1998 and met some amazing families who were on the road with their children. We told ourselves that when we had kids, we would do some sort of overseas adventure with them.

Ten years and three kids later, we were ready. After much searching, we discovered [Escuela Caracol](#), an emerging Waldorf-inspired school in San Marcos La Laguna in Guatemala. Although we had never been to Central America, we didn't speak Spanish and our kids did not attend a Waldorf school, we were compelled to make this little town our home for ten months. Escuela Caracol was only two years old when we arrived in the fall of 2008; there were two open-air classrooms, a small team of local and international staff, and 26 students in grades K-2 including **Kai** who was in kindergarten, **Willow** in first grade and **Sienna** who received extra projects as the only third grader in a first/second grade class.

The founders of the school were a young American couple who had lived in Guatemala for several years and intuitively felt that they needed to start a school that would serve both their daughter and the Mayan children from the local area. They returned to the States and researched a number of educational models and decided that a Waldorf school would best honor and embrace the needs and culture of the Maya who are deeply connected to beauty, community, craft, and the natural world.

Fast-forward to 2014...Escuela Caracol has grown exponentially and my family and I had the incredible fortune of [returning to the school over February vacation to volunteer](#). Caracol is now an accredited Waldorf School that serves over 70 children in kindergarten through sixth grade and has a long wait-list children who want to enroll. On our return visit, we were in awe of the beautiful, two story structure that houses grades two through six, the four new kindergarten buildings, and the expanded grounds, gardens, kitchen (lunch is included for all students), and library.

One of my favorite stories is about Marilily, the quiet, young woman who was Kai's assistant kindergarten teacher in 2009. **She was born in San Marcos to a family of 10 and, when we first met, she had never travelled farther than three hours from her hometown.** When Marilily saw Kai back in February, she was amazed at how much he had grown in five years, and yet Marilily's transformation was just as stunning: she had completed her Waldorf teacher training in Cuernavaco, Mexico and become **the first certified**

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Guatemalan Waldorf teacher. She is now the lead kindergarten teacher at the school and her commitment to the children and her community is tangible.

Escuela Caracol is a beacon of peace and unity in a town that experiences intense poverty and vast divisions among the local, ex-pat and tourist communities. In Spanish *caracol* means snail shell and, for the school, **this spiral formation symbolizes the integration of all of life's facets into a common whole.** Caracol's ability to integrate education in a way that honors the Maya as well as the children whose parents have North American, European and Latin American backgrounds speaks to the creativity of the staff and the wholeness and universality of Waldorf education.

I love sharing Escuela Caracol with others and **I am considering taking a group families to Guatemala next February to volunteer at the school and relax into the beauty of Lake Atitlan.** If this resonates with you, please feel free to [contact me](#).
